White Wine Selection

- 1. Pinot Grigio, Sentina, Italy** **£14.50**
A grape that has only recently come back into favour, producing a superb dry wine which is an ideal accompaniment to fish.
- 2. Chenin Blanc, Eagles Cliff, South Africa** **£15.00**
A grape which seems at its best grown in S. Africa, giving good acidity and producing a stunning crisp, dry wine.
- 3. Sauvignon Blanc, Carte Vieja, Chile** **£15.50**
Grown on the slopes of the Andes, this grape produces a characteristic dry, aromatic wine, with gooseberry and citrus overtones.
- 4. Gewurztraminer Verdelho, Opal Ridge S.E. Australia** **£16.00**
The floral, aromatic Gewurztraminer pairs with the fuller-bodied, more tropical fruit-forward Verdelho resulting in a well-balanced 'off-dry' white that is crisp, fragrant and surprisingly refreshing-perfectly complementing spicy dishes.
- 5. Semillon Chardonnay, Stoney Vale, S.E. Australia** **£16.50**
An un-oaked, soft Australian chardonnay with peach and melon flavours and a long, buttery finish.
- 6. Chateau La Borne 2009, France** **£17.00**
Classic white Bordeaux, A fruity nose with notes of lemon and grapefruit; supple and well balanced on the palate with mineral aromas.
- 7. Sauvignon Blanc, Century Hill, New Zealand** **£18.50**
From a small winery in Marlborough producing the primary fruit, character and crisp acidity that defines a really good Sauvignon
- 8. Riesling "Limited Release", Carta Vieja, Chile.** **£18.50**
Deep floral nose dominated by jasmine and along with lime, green apple and lychee aromas. Long, expressive on the palate, supported by a vibrant acidity. White peach, pineapple and redcurrants flavours are developed on sweet floral notes. Long, clean and balanced finish.
- 9. Chablis, Moreau et Fils, France** **£22.50**
The classic Burgundy white. Greenish in colour, slightly flinty flavour with overtones of hay. Very crisp and deliciously dry. An extremely elegant and stylish wine. Recommended..
- 10. Sancerre, Domaine le Gemiere, France** **£23.50**
The King of Loire wines and probably the most distinctive of French wines. The aroma is almost gun-flint and the flavour slightly spicy and slightly smoky. Made with the Sauvignon grape it still has a superb crispness and acidity. A very well-balanced wine.

11. Pinot Grigio Rosé, Sentina, Italy £15.50
A fine, light and crisp example of this Italian classic, great for summer drinking.

12. White Zinfandel, California USA £14.50
A delicate blush wine, medium sweet, very easy summer drinking

Red Wine Selection

13. Cabernet Merlot, Auction House, Australia £14.50
Luscious berry fruit with gentle blackcurrant flavours. Very easy drinking.

14. Shiraz, Dyka Hills, South Africa £14.50
Delicious berry and spicy aromas. A soft, supple wine, with ripe fruity flavours and a hint of pepper with lovely length on the aftertaste.

15. Merlot, Carte Vieja, Chile £15.00
From an award winning vineyard comes this terrific, full flavoured and superbly well rounded example of the Merlot grape. Exceptional value for money!

16. Pinotage, Eagles Cliff, South Africa £16.00
A deep crimson colour, full of rich spicy aromas without any harsh tannin aftertaste. This wine has a well rounded powerful palate.

17. Chateau Dedicace, Borge Blaye 2008, France £17.00
This award-winning red displays ripe black fruits with spicy notes. It is well-balanced and structured with soft tannins.

18. Malbec, Correas el Cipres, Argentina £17.00
Argentina's premier red grape displays intense red fruit aromas with touches of vanilla-soft inviting flavours. The tannins are sweet and round with an attractive aftertaste.

19. Rioja Crianza, Marques de Caceres, Spain £17.75
Created from a new style of making Rioja, this is blended from four different grapes to produce a food-friendly wine. It is full of flavour with that distinctive oaky tinge of all the finest Riojas.

20. Pinot Noir, Saint Clair, New Zealand **£18.50**

A grape variety they specialise on in those parts! It gives a truly robust wine, full of ripe berry fruit character, all enhanced with a slight spicy oak flavour.

21. Cabernet Sauvignon Gran Reserva, Terranoble, Chile **£19.50**

The grapes for this wine are handpicked from specific plots of low yield in the Loncomilla Valley and only the best go to make the wine. The result is an absolute stunner! The best we have tasted!

22. Fleurie, Domaine de la Madone, France **£22.00**

An excellent cru Beaujolais. Full fruit ripeness, plummy and rounded a classic expression of the Gamay grape.

23. Chateau D'Angles Grand Vin Rouge La Clape, France **£23.00**

From renowned winemaker Eric Fabre, ex- technical director at Chateau Lafite. The nose is an opulent mix of bramble fruits, plums, black cherries and black berries, wrapped in soft, creamy vanilla. The fruit is ripe, juicy and mouthfilling, with sweet spice lingering on the finish. Delicious with game, red meat or a good cheese board.

Sparkling Wines & Champagne

24. House Champagne, Veuve Ricotteau **£30.00**

Excellent value for money from an independent producer. Presents a clean finish, is soft on the palate and compares well with some of the more famous Marques

25. Tattinger NV Brut, Reserva **£40.00**

A famous name which lives up to its reputation for excellent quality. Light straw colour with a clean, crisp finish.

26. Cava, Castelblanch Cristal Brut **£16.50**

A traditional method sparkling wine from the Penedes region of Spain. Dry with long lasting bubbles.

27. Prosecco, Veneto Spago Casa Botter, Italy **£16.50**

A popular lightly sparkling wine from Italy. Delicately fruity, slightly aromatic bouquet with hints of flowers, honey and wild apple scents.
